A few more teachers trickled in through the morning and those who did had to stand in the hallway as there weren't enough chairs to accommodate everyone.



Three teachers I must acknowledge are Anele, Nomphele and Nonkulelko because they did such an amazing job!

These women never cease to amaze me! I could see that they were nervous at first, but as the day went on it was as if they'd been doing this forever. Personally, I thought Anele stood out the most. She always displays such passion that it was inevitable that she would shine! When she arrived she facilitated devotion on II Kings Chapter 2. She then led the women to hold hands and pray in unison. Even when Nomphele and Nonkulelko had finished their sessions, Anele continued and added on to their meaningful discussion.



Mama Nosandla ended the day's session with a few words of encouragement and highlighted the importance of teachers starting each day at school by praying with the children. She also emphasized the significance of good working relationships between principal and teachers.



When everyone left for the day Mama Nosandla and I stayed behind to debrief. Mama Nosandla was so thrilled to see God's plans unfolding before our eyes – she was truly in awe and so was I.

Scholarship Kids



Busiswa is in grade 2. She is very shy, but loves school. When she was in preschool her Father molested her and her older sister – during

that time her mother was pregnant with her youngest sister.

Busiswa has experienced much in her 7 years, but continues to love life. Her mother is Nonkulelko and she is an amazing Grade R teacher at Kulangolwazi. As a single mother she does her best to raise her 3 girls and I must say that she is doing an excellent job.

When I first met Nothando she had sores all over her body, but it wasn't the sores that made me remember this wonderful young lady - it was her smile that left a lasting impression.



Her aunt Monica from the Sinxolo School told me that her dad had recently died and she was now living with her. Monica has adopted her as her own daughter and I'm happy to report that Nothando is a thriving grade 4 student.

Siyasanga is in grade 3 and attends a private Christian school because his mother wants him to receive the best education he can get. 2009 was a hard year for his



family because his father had raped and attempted to kill his mother during the grand opening of the Ubukobahke School. His mother is still healing from her stab wounds and his eldest sister has received ongoing help to deal with the trauma, she is doing well and is now attending college. The scholarship money will be used to pay for Siyasanga's transportation fees because he has to travel quite a distance to get to school.
